# JASMINE "JAZZIE" PIGOTT

Featured Tuba Soloist

Jasmine "Jazzie" Pigott began playing tuba at the age of ten, and she quickly excelled. In 2016, Jasmine became the first Black woman to place in the International Leonard Falcone Tuba

Student Competition. In 2021, Jasmine won the Peabody Conservatory's Yale Gordon Competition, becoming the first tuba player and Black woman to do so in the institution's history. As a college junior in 2018, Jasmine was invited to be a solo artist on the "Promising Artists of the 21st Century" concert series tour in Costa Rica. There, she realized her true passion for performing for people of marginalized backgrounds. Since then, Jasmine has become an activist for increasing the diversity in the field of classical music. In February 2020, Jasmine was awarded the first prize in the Michigan State University Running Start Competition for her grant proposal to commission composers of color to write tuba pieces in Black music styles for her EP, Revolution: The Next Generation of Tuba Music released in July 2022. Jasmine is a co-founder and served as the Director of Development for the Chromatic Brass Collective—an organization devoted to empowering women and non-binary people of color brass musicians.

Jasmine is an active performer, composer, writer, and researcher with a goal to inspire the next generation of Black musicians. She has performed around the United States and Latin America as a solo artist and has also toured with groups such as the Chromatic Brass Collective and Seraph Brass. She has been commissioned as a composer and arranger for works for band, orchestra, tuba, and chamber ensembles.

Jasmine holds Bachelor of Music degrees in music education and tuba performance from Ithaca College and a Master of Music degree in tuba performance from Michigan State University, and she is currently pursuing a Doctoral degree in tuba performance at the Peabody Conservatory. Her teachers include Velvet Brown, Phil Sinder, David Earll, and Justin Benavidez.

#### ABOUT THE BBCI

The Brass Band of Central Illinois was formed in 2004 to actively promote the cultural awareness and tradition of brass bands. It also provides a musical outlet for brass players who enjoy the unique sound and instrumentation of brass band music.



Based in Bloomington as a non-profit organization, the band is dedicated to providing concerts that are both entertaining and educational. Performing a wide variety of music, the band offers indoor concerts in May and December, as well as outdoor concerts every summer. All of our concerts are free and fully accessible to the public, with no admission fee or ticket required.

Our membership is composed of volunteer musicians from all walks of life including current and retired band directors, employees of State Farm Insurance, an anesthesiologist, a civil engineer, a Dept. of Homeland Security employee, and a former railroad engineer. Many of our members reside in Bloomington/Normal, but others travel from Peoria, LaSalle, El Paso, Urbana, Monticello, Gridley, Morton and Pontiac in order to rehearse and perform with the band.



Since 2007, Dr. Sharon Huff has been the Music Director and conductor of the band. Dr. Huff is a retired music professor and former public school music teacher who previously taught at Millikin University, Illinois State University, St. Norbert College, and Unit 5 Schools in Normal, IL. Dr. Huff is a native of Bloomington/Normal, and she holds a B.M.E. summa cum laude from ISU and a M.M. and D.M.A. from the University of Illinois.
